

# 'You are making a communal issue': HC dismisses Pirana shrine PIL



Ahmedabad: The Gujarat high court on Saturday dismissed the public interest litigation (PIL) filed by a Muslim organization over the alleged conversion of the Pir Amnashah Bawa Dargah at Pirana village into a Hindu place of worship, terming the petition "not maintainable" and castigating the petitioner for "making the issue communal".

While dismissing the PIL on grounds of maintainability, the bench headed by Chief Justice Sunita Agarwal commented, "These are issues created

by unscrupulous persons. They are trying to create a community situation. We are not permitting anyone to do this by giving our baton to it."

The CJ said the court was treating the PIL as not maintainable because the petitioner could not provide satisfactory replies to various questions on his locus, credentials and eligibility to file the PIL in the absence of authorization from the managing committee of his own trust, the Sunni Awami Forum.

The court also said that the petitioner could not say why trustees of the Pir

# Rajkot ranked third in water harvesting projects

Rajkot: Saurashtra's commercial capital, Rajkot, has ranked third in the water category in the Indian Smart Cities Award Competition (ISAC) 2022, the results of which were announced Friday in New Delhi. The city, which has historically struggled for drinking water, received this award for water body restoration, rainwater harvesting, and using new technology in conservation.

ISAC is organized under the Smart Cities Mission by the union ministry of housing and urban affairs.

Officials of the Rajkot Municipal Corporation (RMC) said they received the award for the development of Atal Sarovar in the Smart City area. The award will be conferred in an event to be organized in Indore next month. Rajkot city is dependent on Narmada water for half of its drinking water requirement throughout the year. There are limited facilities for rainwater storage, which has necessitated harvesting rainwater.

The concept of dust-free roads and paved surfaces limited the scope of water recharge during the monsoon.

RMC is developing the Smart City project on 930 acres at Rayla. The roads' design is made in a way that

maximum rainwater can be collected in three lakes through a stormwater network. Lake number one, which is known as Atal Sarovar, will be refilled during summer from a tertiary treatment plant (TTP) having a capacity of 8 million litres per day (MLD). The treatment will remove the stubborn contamination in the reused water that remains even after the secondary treatment. The construction of Atal Sarovar on the New Ring Road is nearing completion and the project is expected to be ready by the end of October.

RMC is also distributing treated water for reuse. The water treated in the sewage treatment plant (STP) is made available to selected customers through a pipeline. It is also used in gardens, washing cars, flushing toilets, etc. Officials said 42 nominations from 35 cities were received in various categories such as environment, culture, economy, governance, mobility, sanitation, social aspects, urban environment, water, innovative ideas, etc.

In the past, the ISAC has witnessed three editions in 2018, 2019, and 2020. The fourth edition of the ISAC was launched in April 2022 during the 'Smart Cities-Smart Urbanization' event in Surat.

# South Bopal resident cheated of Rs 93 lakh as deal for scaffolding crashes



AHMEDABAD: A 44-year-old resident of South Bopal has registered a complaint of cheating and breach of trust against three residents of Chennai, who did not pay him Rs 93.94 lakh he was owed.

Mayur Patel registered a complaint at Anandnagar police station against N B Shankar, A P Vinikumar and G Rajshankar, all three are businessmen living in Chennai. Patel said he runs VFL Industrial Services Limited, which provides scaffolding on

contract. Patel said that in June 2018 he got a call from Shankar, who said he works for FL Smith Pvt Ltd, asking for scaffolding. Shankar said he had received a contract from a chemical company in Mithapur.

Patel said he held a meeting with Shankar and Vinikumar. They said they needed 20,000 cubic metres of scaffolding. It was decided that the scaffolding would be returned in three months. He said that in September 2018, when he asked for the return

of the scaffolding, he was informed by Vinikumar that they needed it for two more months. The final billing amount they agreed to was Rs 1.92 crore.

He said that the payment was not made as agreed and the three kept delaying it. In 2019, he went to Chennai to get his payment and was told that the chemical company had held back their payment as completion of the work was delayed. The three accused then told him they could not make the payment within the next 30 days as they had incurred a loss in the project. He said that out of compassion for them in their plight, he signed a document condoning the delayed payment.

He later received an email from them saying they could only pay Rs 95.79 lakh. The three then made a payment of Rs 1.11 crore but refused to pay the remaining Rs 93.94 lakh and thus cheated him.

# Rival plants tracking device in businesswoman's car in Ahmedabad

AHMEDABAD: A 36-year-old businesswoman from Krishnanagar on Friday filed a complaint with Cybercrime police, saying that someone had hidden an AirTag, a tracking device, in her car to stalk her. According to police officers, they have identified a business rival as being behind the stalking using the tracking device. The cost of the button-sized AirTag, was launched in April 2021 as a Bluetooth tracking device to find keys, backpacks, wallets or any other thing to which it is attached. The device does this by showing its location on a map or by playing a sound. The complainant, a

really developer, in her FIR said that when she was driving her car towards her office on June 27, she saw a notification on her iPhone saying "AirTag found moving with you". The next day, when she was moving in her car, she saw that notification again. On June 29, it appeared again and she asked her driver about it. Her driver clicked on the notification and a message popped up saying, "Your current location can be seen by the owner of this AirTag". She then realized that someone was stalking her, after which she submitted an application of complaint to Cybercrime police on July 1.

The notifications were part of the product's built-in anti-stalking feature. The complainant said she had taken her car to a service station in Bopal and got it checked thoroughly. During this, she found an AirTag hidden in the cover of its passenger seat. The AirTag had been stuck there with tape. On July 8, she got her car back from the service station. The next day, she could not find the device there.

A Cybercrime police officer said that a man who was acquainted with the woman had placed the device there to track her. Police have caught the accused.

# Four tour operators cheat 13 Raj men out of Rs 22 lakh

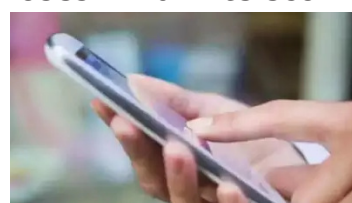
AHMEDABAD: A tour operator from Rajasthan on Thursday filed a complaint with Cybercrime police in the city, alleging that a tour operator from Paldi and his three aides cheated him and 12 others from his village out of Rs 22 lakh.

Kashmiruddin Qureshi, 34, a daily wage labourer from Khandela village in Sikar district of Rajasthan, said that the accused, Mushtaq Ansari, had married a woman from Qureshi's village. Qureshi then found out about Ansari and his work of sending people abroad.

In November 2022, Ansari told Qureshi about job openings in Cambodia and told him he could provide visas and work permits for a bargain. Ansari talked to others about Ansari's offer, he and 12 others from his village decided to approach Ansari. Qureshi said they went to Ansari's office near Kochrab Ashram in Paldi and discussed their going to Cambodia. Ansari and his three aides told Qureshi and 12 others that they would arrange for jobs and visas, for which they would charge each person Rs 1.4 lakh. Qureshi and the others first balked, as they did not have the money. Ansari and his aides told them to pursue the offer if they agreed. They took Rs 22.4 lakh from Qureshi and his fellow villagers between November 2022 and April 2023. Qureshi said Ansari's aides told them to come to a hotel in Jahangir, Delhi, to collect their visas and tickets to Cambodia. When they got to the hotel on April 25, none of them were there and their phones were switched off.

Qureshi approached Cybercrime police and filed a complaint. He said he and 12 others filed a cybercrime conspiracy under IPC along with the charges under the Information Technology Act.

# Preference to new tech: Gujarat loses 42 lakh telecom subscribers



AHMEDABAD: With new technologies like 5G, strict measures imposed for obtaining new connections, the department of telecom has recently tightened rules for verification of customers seeking to obtain new mobile numbers. This has led to slowing uptakes for newer connections, indicate industry players.

As a result, Gujarat saw the number of telecom subscribers fall by 42 lakh in the last few months. According to the latest telecom subscription report by Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI), mobile connections fell from a peak of 7.03 crore subscribers in July 2021 to 6.63 crore in June this year.

With a sharp rise in the number of cases of sim frauds and phishing reported, the department of telecom has recently tightened rules for verification of customers seeking to obtain new mobile numbers. This has led to slowing uptakes for newer connections, indicate industry players.

Getting rid of multiple connections is yet another reason. The introduction of 5G technology played a key role here.

"With only two players launching 5G in Gujarat as yet, there is a significant increase in the number of porting requests. This made economic sense, because 5G technology was available at the same cost," said a telecom industry stakeholder without willing to be named.

Besides new technology, a change in policy was also one of the key reasons for reduction in the number of subscribers. "When there was a semiconductor shortage and a sim shortage, many telecom players decided to deactivate unused mobile numbers within 90 days. This was further brought down to 30 days by many players," an industry player said.

# Insurance firm told to pay 50L death claim to widow

Rajkot: A consumer court in Amreli has directed a private insurance company to pay Rs 50 lakh as the term insurance to the widow of 48-year-old businessman who died within 16 months of purchasing the policy.

The company had rejected the claim submitted by the businessman Dilip Nathwani's wife on the grounds that the latter had not revealed information regarding pre-existing diseases. Nathwani had diabetes and hypertension.

The court upheld her arguments that a recent

Supreme Court order had stated that lifestyle diseases can't be a reason for rejecting claims.

Nathwani had taken a life term insurance cover of Rs 50 lakh from the company for the period from July 22, 2020 to July 22, 2024. The policy would mature on July 22, 2060. However, Nathwani died of a heart attack on November 15, 2021. After his death, his wife, Chhaya applied for claim but she was given only Rs 2.03 lakh premium money and Rs 5 lakh as gratuity. At the time of buying the policy, Nathwani had

submitted the mandatory health certificate as per the rules.

Sagar Rathod, advocate of the applicant, argued, "The insurance company rejected the claim giving an excuse that he was suffering from hypertension and diabetes. However, according to the recent Supreme Court order, these are lifestyle disease and can't be a reason for rejecting the claim."

The consumer court ruled in favour of Nathwani and ordered the insurer to pay the remaining Rs 42.96 lakh with 7% interest.
